AT A Glance

During the Plenary session, we will explore the intersection between the science of climate change and faith and a religious response to the environmental challenges we face today.

Keynote Speakers:

Jason Box, PhD is a climatologist in the Geography Department at Ohio State University and a research scientist at Byrd Polar Research Center. With nineteen expeditions to Greenland since 1994, his work has measured and studied glacier speed changes and glacier flow sensitivity to climate. He will be sharing up to date information about climate change.

Nancy Sleeth is the Program Director of Blessed Earth, a faith-based nonprofit focusing on environmental stewardship. She is the author of “Go Green, Save Green: A Simple guide to saving time, money, and God’s green earth”, which was the first-ever practical guide to going green from a faith perspective. She will share what congregations are doing, nationwide, to engage in creation care.

William Spratley is the Executive Director for Green Energy Ohio. Bill offers a wealth of experience and knowledge in the utility and energy sector, having served as Ohio’s first Consumer’s Counsel and as a national utility consultant.

Dr. Greg Hitzhusen, M.Div., is a Lecturer in the School of Environment and Natural Resources at The Ohio State University. His work and research focuses on the intersection of faith and the environment and developing partnerships between scientific and faith communities.

Continuing her discussion from the morning, Nancy will explore ways we can personally move toward sustainable living. Through a film series entitled “Rest” participants will rediscover Sabbatical living.
